Pre-Licensure Admission Criteria into Nursing for Freshman entering Fall 2018 Enrollment	
Pre-Licensure Freshman students entering the Nursing program for 2018 will need to demonstrate the following qualifications for acceptance into the Nursing Program:

Secondary school program of study should include: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. 4 years of college preparatory English b. Mathematics – Algebra I, II, and Geometry as a recommended minimum. c. 3 years of Science with Biology and Chemistry, including labs, required. d. 2-3 years of social studies e. 2 years of a foreign language (preferred) 3. Students that defer will be assessed on case by case basis 4. Placement into ENG 102 may require an additional semester/year of course work 	

Freshman progression to sophomore year requirements beginning 2018:	
Freshman nursing students must meet the following academic standards to progress into their sophomore year as a nursing student:	
Complete Admission Requirement Courses	
ENG 104 with a C or better	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The student must have been enrolled in 12 or more course credits each semester 2. Overall GPA of 2.5 or better 3. C or better in ENG 103 & 104, Introduction to Sociology, Introduction to Psychology, Human Lifespan Development, and Applied Statistics. 4. C+ (plus) or above is required in Anatomy and Physiology I and II, Introduction to Chemistry, and Microbiology. Only one science 	

<p>course can be repeated once to remain in the nursing major. A course withdrawal is considered as one unsuccessful attempt.</p> <p>5. Students must take the pre and co-requisite courses according to the published curriculum plan in order to progress in the nursing program. All prescribed courses, e.g., general education and science courses, must be successfully completed prior to the Sophomore Spring semester to continue in the nursing program.</p> <p>6. In the event the student does not maintain 12-15 credits per semester, and/or achieve the overall GPA, and C+ or better in designated classes (they may retake the course once); however, the student must withdraw from the nursing program and reapply once minimum requirements are achieved. Based on the nursing class size there is no guarantee space will be available even if the students meets the minimum requirements.</p>

Pre-Licensure Admission Criteria into Nursing for **Internal and External Transfer Students beginning Fall 2018.**

Complete Admission Requirement Courses and above criteria

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. All nursing transfer applicants must successfully complete either the ACT/SAT exam or the TEAS exam. Students who have an ACT Composite score below 19 or a SAT score below 900 on the SAT Critical Reading and Math sections must take and score proficient (required) or higher on the TEAS exam as part of their application. 2. Earned a minimum grade point average of 3.0 for external transfers and a 2.5 for internal transfers. 3. Earned a minimum of 30 transferable credits which must include minimum of ENG 103 or equivalent 4. Completed two of the four major required science courses, one of which must be <u>either</u> Anatomy & Physiology I or II, with a minimum grade of C+ (plus). The major science courses include: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Anatomy and Physiology I 2. Anatomy and Physiology II 3. Microbiology 4. Chemistry (at the level equivalent to AMC's Introduction to Chemistry with a lab component) 5. All science courses must have been completed within the past 7 years. Only one science course can be repeated once to remain in the nursing major. A withdrawal is considered as one unsuccessful attempt to pass a course. 	
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<p>6. A minimum grade of C is required for Introduction to Psychology, Human Lifespan Development, Sociology, and Applied Statistics.</p> <p>7. Pre-licensure BSN students are typically admitted to the fall semester. Students admitted in the spring or transferring into the nursing program may need to take additional courses or semesters to comply with the published curriculum plan.</p> <p>8. Students must take the pre and co-requisite courses according to the published curriculum plan in order to progress in the nursing program. All prescribed courses, e.g., general education and science courses, must be successfully completed prior to the Sophomore Spring semester to continue in the nursing program.</p> <p>Due to the competitive application process only the most academically qualified students (if space available) will be selected. For readmission (Please refer to the Nursing Handbook) or Internal transfer, the deadlines are by the last day of the preceding fall semester courses (any exception will be reviewed case by case), for the Fall. Students who would like to prepare for the TEAS exam should utilize the TEAS resources cited below.</p> <p>Students taking the TEAS exam must achieve an overall score of Proficient or higher on the ATI Version – Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS®). Only <u>two</u> attempts within a 1-year timeframe to achieve the minimum benchmark score will be allowed; this includes any TEAS exam taken at other location. If needed, the TEAS requirement applies to all applicants to the nursing program (including internal and external transfers). It is strongly suggested that an applicant wait 45 days between TEAS exams. The TEAS test is administered at Anna Maria College (fee required).
